Students and Parents

In this pamphlet you will find contacts, mailing addresses, applications and deadlines of various scholarships, bursaries and awards. ***This is a rough guide and it is impossible to keep the information in the pamphlet current. Remember: dates are based on last year's deadlines and change from year to year.***

Watch for memos and listen to announcements on various scholarships, bursaries and programs available. Many universities and colleges, businesses, and organizations offer scholarships, bursaries and awards that you may seek out through advertisements, word of mouth or the internet. The responsibility lies with you to investigate any and all avenues where these scholarships, bursaries and awards may be offered.

Many awards require a copy of your transcript, letters of recommendation/reference or an essay. *Allow yourself and staff members time to prepare any of these requirements.*

Notes:

- Often students who have an average of 80% or higher in Grade 11 and have maintained this average in the first semester of Grade 12 are automatically considered for scholarships to the university or college that they make application to (if institution offers these types of awards). This process usually takes place in February/March. Some universities have separate applications for entrance scholarships. So read carefully and be aware of due dates.
- Students should make an appointment with the School Counselor to assist in planning and applying to universities or colleges.

- Grads and parents who provide the School Counselor with e-mail addresses will receive regular updates.

UPEI has two types of scholarships available to students.

1. Scholarships for which an application is **NOT** required- application for admission must be received by UPEI by March 1st in order to be considered for these scholarships.
2. Scholarships for which an application **IS** required. Some also require essays, references, transcripts etc.

Remember: *Dates are based on last year's deadlines and change from year to year.*

Applications **REQUIRED:**

Avery Scholarship- Deadline: March 1st

- value of \$1000 (entrance)
- 750-1000 word essay on a topic chosen by the board of the L. M. Montgomery Institute
- each entry must be accompanied by a letter from the student declaring that he or she wrote the essay without assistance

CN Pensioners' Association of P.E.I. Award- Deadline: April 30th

- value of \$2000 (non-renewable entrance scholarship)
- must have a grandparent and/or great-grandparent who worked for the CN railway on Prince Edward Island

Dennis and Nell Smith & Family Scholarship- Deadline: April 15th

- value of \$5000 (non-renewable entrance scholarship)
- minimum average of 75%
- demonstrated effort toward contributing financially to his/her own education
- this scholarship is granted on a rotational basis to Nursing, Business and Engineering faculties/programs. It began with Nursing in 2007, Business in 2008 and Engineering in 2009, and will continue in this order.

Doris MacPherson Caseley Memorial Scholarship- Deadline: March 31st

- value of \$2500 (entrance scholarship)
- must be entering the Bachelor of Arts program at UPEI
- minimum average of 75% and a good academic record
- financial need is considered

Dorothy Corrigan Entrance Awards- Deadline March 31st

- value of \$2500 (two available)
- must be entering full-time (five courses per semester) at the University of Prince Edward Island for the first time
- financial need

Dr. Julian Jaynes Memorial Entrance Scholarships in Psychology- Deadline: March 1st

- value of \$1000 (5 non-renewable entrance scholarships)
- must be entering the University of Prince Edward Island who intend to major in psychology
- high academic standing in high school and demonstrate his/her intention to major in the study of psychology

Dr. Ninian LeBlanc Award- Deadline: May 31st

- value of \$2500 (entrance scholarship)
- first year Prince Edward Island high school graduate entering the University of Prince Edward Island
- achieved high academic standing in high school
- has not already received a renewable scholarship
- financial need
- may receive this award for four years provided they maintain the academic requirements established by the University (75% average first year, 80% in the following years)

Eugenie Ann Pineau Memorial Awards- Deadline: August 31st

- value of \$400 each (two entrance bursaries)
- granted to two student entering the Transition program at the University of Prince Edward Island
- based of suitability to the program
- financial need

Evelyn M Cudmore Memorial Scholarship- Deadline: April 15th

- value of \$1000 (entrance scholarship)
- must be a full time UPEI student enrolled in the Faculty of Science, intending to pursue a major from the Department of Family and Nutritional Sciences
- demonstrated volunteer leadership and experience among the following areas: Red Cross or other water safety programs, camp counselor, leader or other notable volunteer activity in outdoor education.

- financial need
- personal statement along with required application

- demonstrated leadership qualities and interest in gerontology

- value of \$4000 (renewable over four years to a total of \$16,000)
- students who have graduated from a high school in Canada and plan on attending university
- minimum average of 80%
- financial need
- leadership qualities and a recognized initiative in funding ones own education

Harry W MacLauchlan Scholarships in Entrepreneurial Leadership- Deadline: March 1st (postmarked)

- renewable full tuition scholarship over 4 years (three available)
- high academic standing
- strong entrepreneurial initiative, high levels of accomplishment. Genuine commitment to the P.E.I. community

Hart-Gorrill Entrance Award- Deadline: April 30th

- value of \$250 (entrance award)
- entering UPEI from a P.E.I. high school and pursuing full time study in the Faculty of Arts
- a student of good character, as demonstrated through extracurricular activity

Leaders of Tomorrow Scholarships- Deadline: April 15th

- value of \$2000 (13 non-renewable scholarships)
- awarded to applicants coming directly from high school to UPEI who are taking full course load (five courses per semester)
- minimum average of 80%

- proven leadership ability, verified by a personal statement and the endorsement of two individuals from the school and the community who will be contacted for references

Mary C McInnis Entrance Scholarship in Nursing- Deadline: April 15th

- value of \$1500 (entrance scholarship)
- P.E.I. high school student entering the Bachelor of Nursing program at UPEI
- high academic standing and financial need

Michael S Kelly Memorial Scholarship- Deadline: March 31st

- full tuition scholarship over 4 years
- demonstrate leadership, community involvement, academic excellence and outstanding athletic ability and who is likely to make a similar contribution to the province

Orin Carver Scholarship- Deadline: May 30th

- value of up to \$3000
- formal statement of academic standing and official academic transcript for most recent academic year completed
- two letters of reference (one school and one community)
- 500 word essay or portfolio in the case of artistic applicants

St Dunstan's Scholarships- Deadline: April 15th

- value of \$5000 (4 scholarships available)
- minimum average of 85% over the final two years of high school
- transcript of high school marks is required
- demonstrate an active involvement in their church on either a parish or diocesan level
- 500 word essay reflecting on what it means to them to be a young Catholic in the 21st century.

Vivian Jenkins Memorial Scholarship- Deadline: March 1st

- value of \$5000 (renewable entrance scholarship)
- must be entering into first year of studies in either the UPEI School of Nursing or Science program.
- personal statement declaring that the student was born in P.E.I. and is the first in their family to attend university
- minimum high school average of 75%

Wanda Wyatt Scholarships- Deadline: March 15th

- value of \$5000 (three renewable scholarships over 4 years available, each totaling \$20,000)
- demonstrate the potential to contribute to the long-term development of the province
- must also demonstrate an aptitude for or interest in the cultural or artistic dimension of life

Wilbert C McInnis Entrance Scholarship in Business- Deadline: April 15th

- value of \$1500
- P.E.I. high school student entering the Bachelor of Business Administration program at UPEI.
- minimum average of 75%
- contribution through volunteer work and financial need

Eligible upon application to UPEI by March 1st - *No Scholarship Application Required*

Alberta McNab-Daley Estate Scholarship

- full tuition (renewable)
- academic achievement and community service

Clan MacPhail Entrance Award

- value of \$250 (non-renewable)
- graduate of an Island high school

Claude and Dr. Bernice Bell Award

- value of \$1000 (renewable)
- must be a full time student enrolled in the Music program
- recipients of the award have exceptional musical ability and/or potential

Diagnostic Chemicals Ltd. Earl and Annie Duffy Scholarship

- full tuition (renewable)
- awarded to a graduate of Kinkora Regional High School with the highest academic standing
- must be enrolled in the Faculty of Science

Eleanor Reesor Wheler Music Scholarship

- must be a full time student enrolled in the Music program, specifically first year piano, string or flute major
